Job Purpose:

To maintain high levels of cleanliness within the parish presbytery and those parts of the Parish Centre currently in use.

Principle duties and responsibilities

1. To undertake general cleaning duties within the Presbytery. This will include:-
 - i. To Hoover all presbytery rooms
 - ii. To clean all communal areas such as the stairs, sitting room, dining room
 - iii. To clean and mop surfaces of all bathroom and toilets
 - iv. To clean and polish all floors and surfaces
 - v. To clean doors and interior windows as required - interior windows to be cleaned monthly
 - vi. To dust walls & curtains as required
2. To undertake laundry duties each week as required (wash, dry & iron bed linen & towels and kitchen linen from Presbytery) as well as any sundry items as directed.
3. To undertake other ad hoc cleaning duties as required in the Presbytery.
4. To undertake general cleaning duties within the Parish Centre at Our Lady & St Christopher's. This will include:-
 - i. To clean the kitchen including kitchen equipment (i.e. cooker, microwave, fridge)
 - ii. To clean and mop surfaces of all toilets
 - iii. To clean and polish (or Hoover) all floors and surfaces of the Hall, Corridors, and bar area
 - iv. To clean doors and interior windows as required
 - v. To dust all equipment in the Office and all surfaces (including desks)
 - vi. To replenish toilets and kitchen with soap, toilet tissues, kitchen paper in a timely manner
5. To undertake any COVID-19 cleaning precautions. This will include:-
 - i. Sanitizing all surfaces in the Parish.
 - ii. Frequently cleaning all touch points within the Parish.
 - iii. Replenishing sanitizing stations.
