Job Purpose:

To work collaboratively with the Parish Priest and pastoral team to develop, support, and coordinate sacramental preparation programmes and volunteer activities that facilitate spiritual growth and deepening faith formation within the parish community.

Principal duties and responsibilities:

Sacramental Preparation Programmes

Support the coordination and delivery of the following where necessary:

- First Holy Communion preparation (liaising with Sr Maureen McNamara rsm)
- Confirmation programmes
- RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Administrative responsibilities:

- Schedule yearly sacramental preparation calendar
- Oversee volunteer onboarding and management for the above purposes
- Maintain accurate attendance records
- Create standard operating procedures and sustainable systems for the above
- Contribute to the collection of data for the Annual Diocesan Survey and allied Mandatory Returns

Volunteer Development and Community Engagement

- Recruit and support volunteers for church duties
- Conduct meetings with catechist teams when necessary
- Build sustainable catechist teams for each programme area
- Serve as liaison with parents and families in catechetical programmes
- Collaborate with diocese for any diocese programmes and initiatives

Programme Development and Evaluation

- Regularly review and update newsletter (and e-newsletter) and parish website
- Conduct programme evaluations and gather feedback
- Ensure programmes align with diocesan guidelines and Catholic teaching
